Why Warden House?

Our inspiring school environment includes extensive grounds, dedicated music room, expansive library, breakfast and after-school club, on-site nursery, two football pitches, woodland area, environmental pond and a range of play equipment to keep our children active and engaged. Such resources enable our children to become confident and well-rounded individuals with a deep capacity for learning. Lessons are engaging and follow a rigorous curriculum with regular intervals of assessment to ensure our children are embedding their learning. As a result, our children make strong progress across the curriculum.

Our children make strong progress as they move through the school because of the excellent teaching they receive. Each class has at least one Teaching Assistant supporting the learning. As a result children receive a high level of guidance and challenge in their learning.

We recognise the importance of extra-curricular learning and host a varied program of after school activities. Clubs include dance, football, chess, Lego, golf, choir, multi-sports, science, art and cricket. We also host a range of music tutors who use our dedicated music rooms to tutor children in a variety of

instruments. We also have three after school tutorials to develop our

children's skills leading towards the Kent Test.

Getting the basics right

Ensuring your child has the strongest opportunities for the future, all children are introduced to early reading and writing skills. Reading skills are supported by a phonics program called 'Letters and Sounds'; this enables your child to develop a strong understanding of phonics and as a result become a competent reader, speller and writer.

Your child is also encouraged to develop a love of reading with structured books that encourage you child's reading and comprehension to grow. Once your child reaches a reading age of 7 years, they are placed on the Accelerated Reader scheme where they choose novels from our extensive library and use our laptop computers and iPads to complete comprehension quizzes that review their progress.

We also encourage your child to become exceptional writers, with regular opportunities to write extended pieces of work in a range of writing genres. Teachers ensure that children are exposed to a range of high-quality, rich, subject-specific vocabulary that children are encouraged to use in their independent writing and spell accurately using a range of strategies.

Your child is encouraged to experience real-life situations in their mathematical learning. If children see a purpose for maths in their lives, they are more likely to excel in the subject.

We also encourage a high level of maths homework, allowing children to rehearse their mathematical skills and become secure in their knowledge of times tables as soon as possible.



Nurturing an enquiring mind

Computing, Science and History

Warden House Primary School has an extensive range of computing resources. We use laptop computers across the school, iPads, Google Chromebooks, Kindle Fires and a range of online programs to support our children's learning across the curriculum. We want your child to understand the power of computing in their learning and to recognise the safe use of these technologies. We teach computer coding so children acquire programming skills that equip them for a diversely changing technical world.

Through our science curriculum, your child is encouraged to explore their enquiring mind. Scientific questions are posed and your child will use their skills and understanding to make sense of our remarkable world and universe. Philosophical thinking is encouraged in science to encourage our children to ask deep questions about the world and their place within it.

Historical enquiry will offer your child opportunities to develop their analytical mind as they solve historical problems and learn about the past with a range of British and world history. Wherever possible we make our historical topics practical, visiting a range of historical sites locally and further afield.

As an academy, we are free to devise our own curriculum content and we do so with relish, utilizing our diverse historical heritage in the local area; this makes historical learning both engaging and fun for our children.



Nurturing a cultural mind

Religious Education, Geography and Primary Languages

We believe your child will thrive with an understanding of the cultural diversity of life in multi-cultural, modern day Britain. With our school curriculum, we aim to increase children's awareness of the range of religions, languages and cultures globally. We recognise that our job market is becoming increasingly global and we see cultural education as a powerful route in preparing your child for the future workplace.



We follow the Kent Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education (2018), and children are taught to learn about and learn from a range of world religions. We teach children the importance of tolerance and understanding and to challenge discrimination.

Once they move into Key Stage Two, children will learn French as our lead modern foreign language.

In geography, children learn to appreciate and understand the world in which we live; how it has evolved and how it continues to evolve. Geography at Warden House explores the relationship between the Earth and its people through the study of place, space and environment.

Nurturing a healthy heart and mind

Physical Education and Personal, Social, and Health Education

Your child's sporting excellence and good health are encouraged through a wide range of engaging activities. We develop early mobility skills through the active use of our extensive outdoor environment.

As an academy, our sports curriculum is enhanced through specialist teaching with a curriculum that includes golf, tennis, cricket, geocaching, street dance, maypole dancing and fencing. Children also enjoy a range of specialist clubs including, cricket, football, tag rugby, speed-stacking, dodge-ball and multi-skills. Your child will also be involved in special "Olympic" days and sports' days across the year where they experience a range of different and varied activities.

Children are taught to swim during regular lessons at Tides Leisure Centre.

Children's safety is paramount at Warden House and your child will be taught in a school where their interests are at the centre of all we do. We have a strong anti-bullying policy and we do not accept poor behaviour.



Our experienced staff have high expectations for all our children and have firm expectations of positive behaviour.

Nurturing an artistic mind

Art, Drama, Music and Design Technology

Your child will explore their creative minds at Warden House. From the early experiences of using role play to develop their communication and story telling skills to the impressive final year production. The arts offers your child a powerful outlet for their creative learning. In art, your child will develop their understanding of and love for the visual arts. Exceptional artists will also be developed through our gifted and talented Art Club.



If your child has a flair for music, we will develop this further through our curriculum and additional music lessons. Your child will learn a range of instruments as they move through the school. Class instruments lessons include the recorder, ocarina, ukulele and trombone. We have a dedicated music practice room where private tutors will teach children in small groups or individually tutor in a range of instruments. Our choir club also meet weekly to perform several times a year.

Your child's ability to solve problems in design technology will enable them to build their spatial awareness while constructing a range of exciting projects including building dioramas, Tudor houses, vehicles and picture frames.

Jungle Club

Warden House Primary School provides a popular Breakfast Club, Afterschool Club and Holiday Club for all pupils on a first come-first served basis. Jungle Club is based in it's own dedicated building and is located by the London Road entrance to the school.

Breakfast club

Breakfast Club is held every morning term time only. It runs from 8.00 a.m. until 8.45 a.m.

Afterschool Club

After School Club runs every afternoon term time only from 3.15pm - 6.15pm

Holiday Club

Our Holiday Club runs every day of the holiday (apart from between Christmas, New Year and Bank Holidays) between 8.00 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Applying for a place at Warden House

Admissions Procedure



Published Admission Number: 60

Warden House is a popular school so you must put us as your number one school when completing the Common Application Form.

Acceptance of an Admission Form by the school does not guarantee a place at the school. The governors agree to admit up to 60 children to the Early Years Foundation Stage Class, each year.

Should the number of admission forms submitted exceed this number, preference will be given on the following basis:

- ⇒ Children in Local Authority Care
- **⇒** Health and Special Access Reasons
- ⇒ **Current Family Association** (E.g. having a sibling at school on the date of admission)
- ⇒ Nearness of children's homes to school
