## **Key Knowledge**

Milk, yoghurt, cheese, butter, ice cream, chocolate and custard all contain milk. Milk is produced by dairy farmers.

Bananas, oranges, pineapples, peaches and mangoes are not grown on farms in Britain. We buy these fruits from other countries that are hotter. This is called trade.

We grow sugar beet plants in the UK. However, most of the world's sugar is produced in tropical climates. Too much sugar is not good for you.

You can buy fresh fruit and vegetables from the greengrocers.

Some people buy free range items. This means that the animals where the food comes from have been kept in their natural conditions and have lots of space to move.

Key Vocabulary and Phrases	
Import	Bring goods or services into a country from abroad for sale.
Export	Send goods or services to another country for sale.
Locally produced	Items that are produced in the local area. For example, foods that have been grown/produced on a nearby farm.
Trade	Buying and selling items or services.
Economic activity	This describes how well a country or place is doing in producing and making goods, and how much money it has. The amount a country sells and makes is called economic activity.
