

Key Vocabulary and Phrases		
Normans	From Normandy in France, descendants of Vikings (North men)	
Bayeaux Tapestry	Embroidery which tells the story of the Battle of Hastings (from the Norman perspective).	
Domesday Book	A record of all land and property, completed in 1086.	
Feudal system	A type of social and political system in which landholders provide land to tenants in exchange for their loyalty and service.	
Peasants	Ordinary people, who worked on the land and had to serve their feudal master, often a knight.	
Magna Carta	A document that gave certain rights to the English People.	
The Black Death	The Black Death was a bubonic plague pandemic.	
Wars of the Roses	The Wars of the Roses were a series of battles. The fighting was between two families that claimed the right to the throne—the House of York and the House of Lancaster. They were called the Wars of the Roses because the symbol of each house was a rose.	
Century	A period of 100 years.	
Chronology	Putting events in the order they happened.
