#### 'Southern Water' Planters

Our site manager Mr. Richards has been in touch with Southern Water who have kindly provided us with several large planters for our school site as part of their "Slow the Flow" initiative. This eco-minded campaign is designed to slow the flow of rain water during periods of heavy rain to stop the drain and sewer system from being overloaded.



Last week a team from Southern Water visited the school to install the planters and work with some groups of children to plant them up with some hardy perennials that will enhance the appearance of our school site.



Southern Water's Project Lead Nicole McNab said about the project:

"This is a fantastic project that showcases how crucial partnership working is. I'd like to thank the schools, students and staff for participating in the scheme, as well as the Department for Education for establishing the programme.

"All the schools involved are helping to slow the flow of rainwater entering our network, and we have seen real enthusiasm from all taking part. It has given us a great opportunity to explain the work we're doing to reduce flooding and storm overflows to a younger audience and answer any questions teachers may have."
