English

Science

RE



Maths

This term, we will be continuing our learning of multiplication and division. Towards the end of term, we will be learning about length and height, capacity, mass and temperature. We will be working on learning our 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Please can you support your child at home by practising these regularly.

History

Our History topic is 'Who is the Greatest History maker?'. We will learn about 3 key history makers: Samuel Pepys, Florence Nightingale and Harriet Tubman. Children will decide at the end who was the greatest history maker.

DT

In DT, the children will learn how to make linkages by making levers and pivots. They will apply these skills to design and make their own monsters.

PSHE

This term we are starting a new PSHE unit called *Healthy Me*. Themes around how to make good decisions about staying healthy will be explored across the term.

Music
