English and Phonics

We will continue to follow the Little Wandle scheme focusing on decoding, prosody and comprehension. We will be covering the Phase 4 Phonics. Please refer to the weekly handout about the sounds covered. **Books we will be using:** The Little Red Hen Rosie's Walk What the Ladybird Heard A Squash and a Squeeze The Vegetable Patch

Expressive Arts and Design

Explore, use, and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings. Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.

Communication and Language Children will listen to and talk about

stories to build familiarity and understanding. Engage in nonfiction books. Listen to and talk about selected non-fiction to develop a deep understanding of the world.

Maths

Children will become more familiar with numbers beyond 10 and the pattern (stable order) of numbers to 20 and beyond. Children will be familiar with larger numbers from daily routines such as counting children or the days in the month.

Managing Self

This term children will be working on increasing their awareness and responsibility. Children will be encouraged to communicate effectively – listen, speak and reflect.

PSHE Relationships

Children will identify some of the jobs they do in their family and how they feel like they belong. They will learn how to make friends to stop themselves from feeling lonely and make friends and manage feelings.

Physical Development

Children will different movements with ease and fluency.

They will develop the overall body strength, co-ordination, balance, and agility needed to engage successfully with future physical education sessions and other physical disciplines including dance, gymnastics and sports.

They will develop the foundations of a handwriting style.

Understanding the World

Children will be learning about how the world has changed over time.

They will explore the natural world around them. Draw information from a simple map.

Self - Regulation

Children will learn to work with and negotiate with others. They will learn to understand how others feel and explore the concept of empathy. Children will learn about independence and how to negotiate with others.

Music

Transport

Using voices, bodies and instruments to explore different types of transport, identify and mimic transport sounds (KAPOW scheme).
