Jacqueline Hurley is a British artist widely regarded as the country's leading remembrance artist having had the honour of exhibiting her artwork at the National Memorial Arboretum, The Royal Albert Hall for the Festival of Remembrance, and at the St Clement Danes RAF Memorial Church in London.

Hurley starting painting her Remembrance Collection in 2014. Her first work was created as a tribute to a friend she lost whilst he was serving in Afghanistan in 2008.

Since 2014 Hurley's artwork has helped raise over £ 280,000 for military charities.

She paints in both an expressionist and impressionist style. The red poppies are contrasted against the monochrome (black, white and grey) background making them stand out vividly. The silhouettes are used to help the audience connect with the works in a more emotional and sentimental way.
