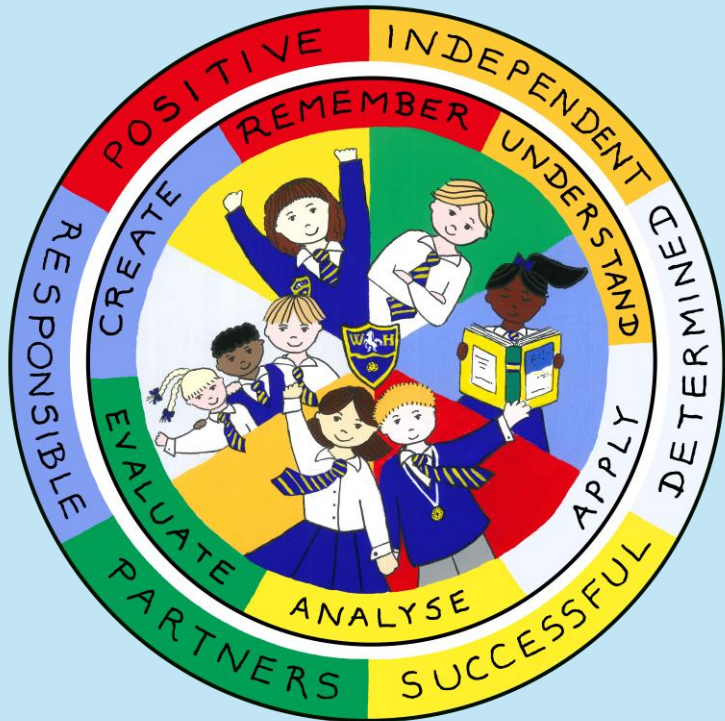


Year 6 Residential Trip

8th – 10th June 2026

Why do we run a residential trip?



To promote independence and resilience.

To develop the team and partnership skills of the children.

To provide an enriching opportunity for all children to be involved in outdoor and adventurous activities that cannot be readily offered on the school site itself.

Where we are staying



"Creed Outdoor Learning Trust Ethos is to get young people outdoors and active, trying new things and increasing their social circle and creating an awareness of their surroundings, which is known to be beneficial for their mental health and wellbeing. To give every child that we work with a chance to learn new skills, develop and improve old skills and to increase self confidence by giving them a taste of adventure in a safe, secure environment."

How are we getting to and from the centre

- Children will come to school at normal time on Monday 8th June 2026
- Once registered and settled we will then walk to Middle Deal Road bus stop.
- We will be travelling by coach to Creed Outdoor Learning Centre leaving at approximately 9.30am
- We will arrive at the centre at approximately 10.30am
- When we return to school on the Wednesday children will be collected from the school hall at approximately 4.30pm

What the children will need

- Clothing that covers skin (long sleeves and trousers) that they do not mind getting dirty or wet. Children do not need to over pack they need to have a set of clothes they are wearing and a spare set for changing into.
- A toothbrush and toothpaste
- A travel sized soap/wash gel.
- Roll on deodorant
- A single bedsheet, this is to be used as a liner inside the provided sleeping bag.
- Children may bring their own sleeping bag if they have one.
- Night clothes
- Suncream
- A sunhat
- A water bottle
- A towel
- A lightweight rain jacket/pack-a-mac/poncho
- A pillow and pillowcase
- A pair of trainers
- Individually wrapped/sealed snacks e.g. cereal bars - no chocolate please. These will be collected in before the trip and adults will supervise access to the children's snacks over the two days.
- No mobile phones or electronic devices are permitted on the trip.
- All items will need to be labelled with the child's name.

Facilities

- Tents for the children are 6 person tents, each will be positioned on an all-weather base.
- Boys and girls will be kept in separate tents.
- Children will know who their tent partners are prior to the trip.
- Children are each provided with roll mats to sleep on.
- The tent area is setup within an enclosed and fenced off section of the site, with toilet facilities available next door to the tents.
- There are movement activated lights for safety and visibility accessing the toileting and wash facilities.
- Washing facilities are available for morning evening routines , e.g. hand and face washing and brushing teeth.



Food

- All dietary requirements for allergies and intolerances can be catered for.
- Breakfast, lunches and evening meals are prepared on site.
- We will be sending further requests for medical and dietary information prior to the trip. This will be needed so we can adjust any plans and prepare everything in advance.

Supporting adults

- The trip will be facilitated by the class teachers and other supporting members of the school staff. Children will know who the adults on the trip are prior to the visit.
- The Creed Centre provide instructors for the activities onsite as well as for the preparation of the meals.
- Members of the Creed Outdoor Learning team also stay onsite overnight during the camping trip.

Next steps

- We will share further information shortly this will include requests for consents and medical information and a finalised kit list.
- Closer to the time of the trip we will take tent partner preferences from the children. These will be used to support the organisation of the tents into positive tent groups.
- One additional experience that may further support the children prior to attending the camp is having a sleepover at a friend's or relative's house.
