Climate Change Research Hub

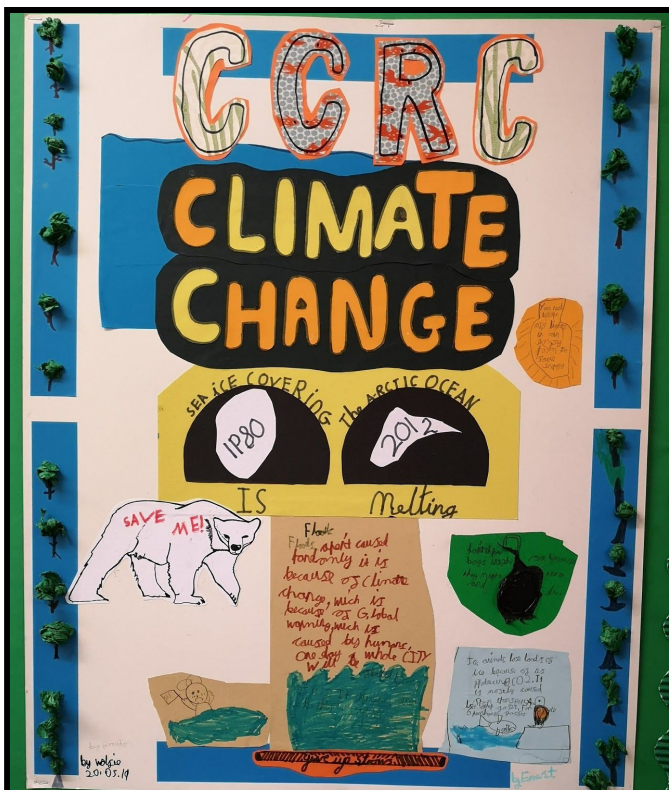
