This was the twelfth year that Mister O'Sullivan has visited Warden House and he never ceases to inspire our children (and staff!).

### School dinner Price Increase

Whole School Meals have sent the following message about a change to the price of a school meal from next term:



*"It is with much regret that we are having to increase the cost of our school meals. Food prices are going up on a weekly basis coupled with labour costs and we are unable to sustain the impact any longer."*

*From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023 the cost of a school meal for a child will increase to £2.41 in line with the current government allowance for a FSM. An adult meal will increase to £2.50 plus VAT.*

*I am sure you will agree that this is still great value for money for a healthy, 2 course lunch and we thank you for your continued support."*

### Bigfoot Pantomime

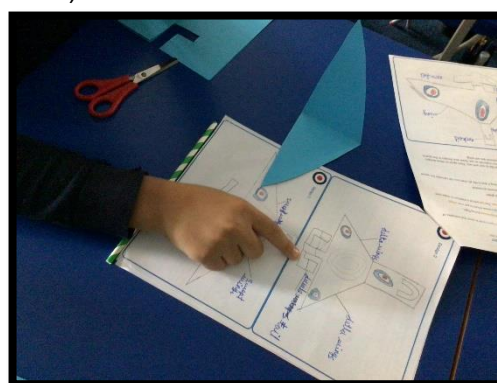

### Year 5 STEM Day

On Thursday last week, our Year Five pupils took part in the Road to RIAT (Royal International Air Tattoo) STEM project. This fantastic programme is sponsored by the RAF and allows primary school pupils the opportunity to further explore the exciting world of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).



During the morning, the children took part in an activity called "The Space Challenge". Working in teams, they designed, built and tested a rocket for launching a satellite into space.



Then in the afternoon, the children took part in a different activity – "The Sustainability of Aerospace" – challenging them to design a sustainable aircraft of the future, before developing a poster to present their ideas.

It was a super day with some fantastic, high-quality learning for our children.



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### Year 4 Invasion!



Our Year 4 Zebras class had a surprise after assembly on Wednesday when they returned to find that their classroom had been "invaded" by William the Conqueror (and some of his friends from Sharks Class!) The children were shocked to find other children in their places, speaking to them in another language- and refusing to leave!

This activity gave the children a first-hand opportunity to reflect on the impact of an "invasion" as they continue their history topic on the legacy of William the Conqueror. It also allowed the children an opportunity to empathise with communities affected by foreign invasion and recognise the long lasting and damaging effects of such actions on societies.

### Medication in school

We are very happy to administer medication in school as needed. In order for this to happen, please visit the school office to complete a medical form.

Please note that for prescribed medication such as antibiotics where there is no set time gap between

doses, our default position is to ask that this is administered out of school time if the requirement is for three doses across the day.



This can usually be managed before school, after school and before bed. Of course, if attendance at clubs or other circumstances mean that this is not possible we are of course happy to administer the medication in school. Thank you for your support with this matter.

### Attendance – including lates

We have noticed a significant increase in the numbers of children arriving late to school over the past few weeks.

It is really important that parents do everything possible to ensure children arrive at school on time so that they enter the classroom ready for an **8:45am start**. If your child arrives after 8:45am, they must be brought to the office and signed in with a reason for the lateness given.

As you will be aware, our start of day times have changed since September with classroom doors opening at 8:40am in readiness for an 8:45am start.





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Please note that lateness will be recorded as an unauthorised absence in our registers. Any child arriving after the register has closed will receive an unauthorised absence which may result in a Penalty Notice being issued.

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can sometimes use that it can be hard for us as parents to keep up with the changes.

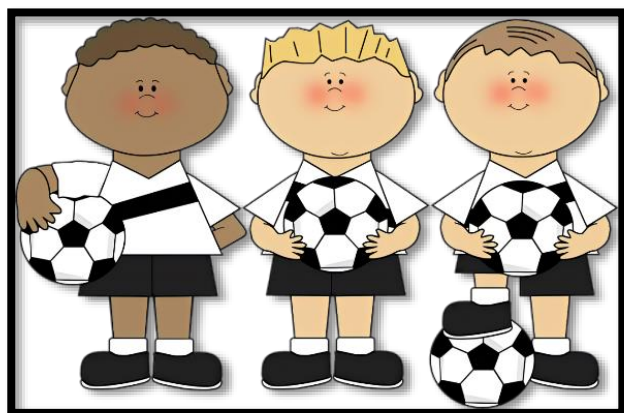
